Fountain Lakes has a dedicated and enthusiastic group of Pickleballers that meet every day to play America's fastest growing sport. Pickleball has seen a meteoric rise in popularity and for many of us it's the perfect combination of fun, exercise, socializing and just an amazing way to enjoy the sun and warm weather. Pickleball is the sport with the weird name that was created in 1965 in Washington state and is easy to pick up and super addictive to play. For many it rekindles the sense of sport and competition from youth but doesn't require a youthful body to play. Pickleball also doesn't require a lot of money to get started with beginner paddles readily available to buy (or borrow) balls are a couple bucks each and court shoes are suggested but not required. I have been playing Pickleball for 5 years after "retiring" from about 40 years of Tennis and I really enjoy introducing the game to new players and coaching seasoned players to help them achieve their goals and enhance enjoyment of the game!

Pickleball is played at Fountain Lakes and many places as a "drop-in" sport where most often people come as singles or pairs and join the group playing with different people as much as possible. LOOKING AT THE MEDIAN PRICES ENTERING 2023, MANY REALTORS QUESTIONED IF IT WOULD HOLD UP, IT NOT ONLY HELD UP BUT SLIGHTLY INCREASED BY \$35,000. OVERALL, WE HAVE A VERY HEALTHY MARKET, IT IS A LITTLE MORE BALANCED, IT IS STILL SLIGHTLY A SELLERS MARKET BUT THE SELLER HAS TO BE REALISTIC. I SEE A LOT MORE THINGS THAT COULD POSITIVELY IMPACT THE MARKET IN 2024 THAN THINGS THAT COULD NEGATIVELY IMPACT THE MARKET IN 2024.

RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT WES DICKERSON



In 1980, I attended a Hot Air Balloon meet held in Battle Creek, MI. This was where my balloon career started. In 1981, we had the pleasure of hosting and working with the Spanish Champion. After the 1981 World's, I decided to start working on my balloon pilot license. I received a private pilot license in 1981 and a commercial rating in 1983. Since 1981, I have accumulated over 1200 flight hours in a hot air balloon. The last balloon we owned was named FORE II, since it was the fourth hot air balloon that we owned. Each balloon had three primary colours of red, black, and yellow; each balloon had a slightly different design or pattern. The retrieval of the balloon on the very first training flight had to be completed using a farm tractor with a lift. It was never repeated in 43 years of flying.

I started attending hot air balloon meets as a new pilot and over the years worked my way up to becoming the senior pilot. During the time I spent going to different events, I became interested in Remote Control balloons. There was not a dealer for these little balloons, so I wound up building my own. Not only did they operate just like a full-scale balloon, but the basket was hand-woven, burners were handmade, and assembled in our basement. In total, I built five remote control balloons. They ranged in size from 2000 cubic ft to just over 4400 cubic ft.

In 2010, I retired from the auto industry as the Worldwide Material Sourcing Manager for TMD Friction. That same year, I started working with the special shape balloons. The first group was the Purple People Eater and Mr Skunk balloon. This tour lasted approximately 3 years. During the winter months, I toured with Post Cereal Balloons, Sugar Bear, The Post Racer Balloon, and the Cereal Bowl Balloon. I also started working with the Balloon Glow tour, featuring tethered balloon rides and the tune balloons. These balloons resembled Tweety Yellow Bird, Sylvester the Cat, Tom, and Jerry. The Reindeer and the Snowman balloons were added to complete the group.

In 2013, we purchased our condo in Fountain Lakes and became official snowbirds that year. We became full-time Florida residents in 2022. Since 2013, we have become more active in the community. I served on the Villas Board in the past as president and board member for four years. I am currently serving on the Main board for Fountain Lakes, as well as the ARC committee and FLIC co-op. I have organized the FLOP for the last five years for Fountain Lakes.
