October Board Highlights

The 2026 Budget has been approved. Copies have been emailed or mailed to all residents, with additional copies available in the office. Assessments for the Master Association will increase from \$350.00 to \$370.00 per quarter. The Board approved completing all three phases of the swale reconstruction project in 2026, rather than spreading them over several years. This decision aims to alleviate the flooding that has occurred along FLBD. The total project cost for all phases combined is \$67,980—up from the original \$26,010 estimate for Phase 1 alone—resulting in overall savings of \$4,400.16 reserve monies were used not impacting the 2026 budget. Paradise Windows was selected as the lowest and most competitive bidder for the Community Center window and door replacement project, at \$121,867 —well below the original budget of \$231,000. This

UNDERSTANDING OUR BUDGET AND FINANCIAL PLANNING

Careful budgeting and responsible spending are essential to ensuring that our association can meet its financial obligations, maintain and enhance the beauty of our community, and continue offering the recreational and entertainment opportunities that make Fountain Lakes such an enjoyable place to live.

While it's important to maintain the quality of our community, we must also remain fiscally responsible. Staying within budget is critical. Rising costs must be managed carefully to minimize increases in HOA dues and, importantly, to avoid the need for special assessments.

To achieve this balance, our financial planning is guided by two primary budgets:

- The Operational Budget covers the community's day-to-day expenses—everything from landscaping and maintenance to utilities and management fees.
- The Reserve Budget is dedicated to future and larger-scale projects. It ensures we have funds set aside for major repairs and replacements, such as roofing, paving, or amenity upgrades.

In 2024, we conducted a Reserve Study to help guide our long-term financial planning.

This study included:

- A physical inspection of our common areas
- · A financial analysis of our reserve fund
- A recommended funding plan to ensure adequate resources are available when major projects arise.

Our ultimate goal is to preserve and improve Fountain Lakes while maintaining a strong financial position—protecting both our property values and our residents' wallets.

Koreshan State Park, A Local Park and Former Cult,

but so much more.

The Koreshan people, led by Dr. Cyrus Teed, believed in Koreshanity. The beliefs of this alternative, seemingly Christian denomination are vast. They range from abstinence to equality, in a time when the latter was foreign to many. Koreshan State Park is much more than acres of wild Florida, preserved historical buildings, and a boat ramp. Inside the gates of Koreshan is a story of pioneers who made Estero what it is today. We need not only focus our attention on the past but also the present. Many of our fellow citizens find refuge within today's Eden, a place where nature presides and reigns.

Looking back to the 1800s, a young Cyrus Teed is practicing eclectic medicine. This alternative, more homeopathic form of medicine believed in natural healing rather than pharmaceutical trysts. However, this practice came with scrutiny and hesitancy from other professionals within the medical field. This separation from the norm became quite common for Dr. Teed. Born in 1839 in New York, Cyrus's family had hoped that he would become a Baptist preacher, like his grandfather. It is safe to say that this familial expectation would not come to pass. Dr. Teed was married and had a son. His son would go on to travel throughout Europe, painting what he saw. Within the Art Hall today, there are multiple paintings completed by Dr. Teed's son. Also within the Art Hall sits a piano, one of few in existence due to its number of keys; it is still playable. Dr. Teed died in 1908. His followers believed he would rise, and so they waited several days before finally burying him. He was then buried on Estero Island, and after a hurricane, his body was washed away to sea. The Koreshan Unity began to slim down in membership over the following years, no doubt fueled by the disappointment of their Prophet not rising as he promised. In the mid-1900s, Hedwig Michel joined the Koreshan people. She was from Germany and Jewish. She would later receive reparations from Germany. Hedwig would go on to lobby the state of Florida to make Koreshan a state park, to preserve it and its history. She also helped the community reclaim some of its former glory through businesses, publicity, and the continuation of publishing The Flaming Sword (a Koreshan-led article that was in existence from the 1890s to the mid-1900s).

Some of the other buildings located on the property are the Planetary Court, which housed the women who ran the Koreshan Unity (the name of the Koreshan commune before becoming a state park). There is also the Founder's House, where Cyrus Teed lived. The General Store also remains, though it is not open to the public; it can be seen from Highway 41. There is also the bakery, cottages, and even some of the larger machinery utilized by the Koreshans. Moving on, Koreshan State Park also offers trails lined with bamboo forests that have been carved into by those pairing their initials together.

Koreshan State Park is not only a living monument to the past and the history of Estero but also a basin of nature that welcomes both exploration and education of the natural world.
